


All learning is social. Collaboration helps

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Facilitating Class Discussions



Discussion Agenda Etiquette rules such as muting, un-muting, and avoiding talking

over one another are crucial to successful class discussions. Provide an agenda to make the discussion purposeful. When students go off topic, steer learners back to the subject **Best Practices**


